The Council of Infrastructure Financing Authorities (CIFA) invites members of the Clean Water and Drinking Water State Revolving Funds (SRFs) and the SRF community to submit a proposal to participate in the 2024 CIFA SRF Workshop, the nation's premier professional development program for SRF managers and staff.

| THEME | "Eureka! State Solutions for the SRFs" is the theme of the 2024 CIFA SRF Workshop. Eureka, California's state motto, means "I have found it!" in Ancient Greek. That's the goal of every CIFA SRF Workshop - to help the SRFs discover solutions to the most pressing water challenges of our time. |
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| AUDIENCE | The CIFA SRF Workshop is the largest annual convening of SRF managers and staff in the nation . Last year, 469 people attended the Workshop, with nearly 60% of attendees from state programs. The Workshop also draws leadership and staff of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and members of the finance, engineering, and technical assistance sectors. |
| FOCUS AREAS | CIFA's professional development program focuses on what's working, what's new and what's next for the SRFs, such as: 1. How can SRFs make the most of the last two years of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA)? 2. What are lessons learned from the IIJA? 3. What's working with lead service line inventories and replacement? 4. What's new in mitigating the threat of emerging contaminants? 5. What's next for "green" projects, programs and financing? 6. How can the SRFs help utilities build physical and financial resiliency? 7. What's next for financial policies - interest rates, fees, additional subsidy and leveraging? 8. How will SRFs maximize use of their funds while maintaining the funds in perpetuity? |

| PROPOSALS | CIFA welcomes proposals from across the water sector, including state and federal governments, business sectors such as engineering, finance and software, and not-for-profit organizations. Fresh perspectives are encouraged. The CIFA Professional Development Committee evaluates proposals based on subject matter and relevance to the SRFs. |
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| PROPOSAL REQUIREMENTS | Proposals must include: Presenter Name(s) and Bios (50 - 60 words) Agency, Business or Organization (full name) Contact Information (email and phone number) Proposed Title (up to ten words) Learning Objective (up to 100 words) Description (up to 500 words) |
| LEARNING OBJECTIVES | Proposals must have one or more clearly defined learning objectives, which define the specific information, skills, and strategies that attendees will acquire from the presentation. Examples: • SRFs will learn strategies to streamline their program procedures. • SRFs will learn how to improve their cash flow modeling. |
| SESSIONS | The program has up to 20 breakout sessions on multiple concurrent tracks. Sessions can be comprised of presentations or a roundtable discussion. Sessions are 75 - 90 minutes. Sessions, typically, have a moderator and three panelists. Sessions with presentations usually provide 20 minutes for each presentation, followed by moderator-led discussion or audience Q&A. |
| RESENTERS | Presenters are eligible for a discounted registration rate . Presenters are responsible for their own travel and accommodations. Presenters are responsible for registering and submitting materials by published deadlines. |
