Problems being faced by Little Rock, AR

Lawsuit with Sierra Club over overflows

 CAO with the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality over overflows

 25 years of replacing their collection system and still not in compliance

 The incremental cost to remove leaks is getting cost prohibitive

New Eligibilities in the 2014 Amendment

 As amended, the FWPCA now includes section 603(c)(8), which states that each CWSRF may provide financial assistance:

(8) to any municipality or intermunicipal, interstate, or State agency for measures to reduce the energy consumption needs for publicly owned treatment works;

New Eligibilities in the 2014 Amendment

What this means:

Projects that will reduce Infiltration/Inflow (reduce energy needed to pump wastewater) are eligible whether or not the recipient is a POTW or not.

So, replacing the service line from the house for I/I reasons is eligible. Replacing these lines is more cost effective that continuing to replace the collection system.

Problems faced by ANRC by participating

 Evaluating the financial risks of individual homeowners. We would rather fund Utility.

Minimum Requirements of CWSRF

- As amended, the FWPCA section 602(b)(6) now states:
 - (6) treatment works eligible under this Act which will be constructed in whole or in part with assistance made available by a State water pollution control revolving fund authorized under this title, or section 205(m) of this Act, or both, will meet the requirements of, or otherwise be treated (as determined by the Governor of the State) under sections 511(c)(1) {Environmental Review} and 513 {Davis-**Bacon Wage Rates**} of this Act in the same manner as treatment works constructed with assistance under title II of this Act;

Minimum Requirements of CWSRF

 As amended, the FWPCA now includes section 608, which states:

SEC. 608. REQUIREMENTS. (a) IN GENERAL. — Funds made available from a State water pollution control revolving fund established under this title may not be used for a project for the construction, alteration, maintenance, or repair of treatment works unless all of the iron and steel products used in the project are produced in the United States.

How Little Rock's needs were met

Sewer Service Line Replacement Program

This is a rebate program to partially pay for homeowners to completely replace the sewer service line. It is currently capped at \$2,500 per project. This program has been in existence since June 2012. The Utility collects \$1 from each customer each month that is put into a separate account used to pay for this program.

This program has the potential to meet the Utilities need to reduce I/I and achieve compliance on overflows.

How Little Rock's needs were met

Sewer Service Line Replacement Program

The demand for this program is out stripping the funds collected. This means the Utility can't meet its compliance goals.

The Utility asked ANRC to provide additional funds to the program so more can be done now and in the future.

How It Works with CWSRF Funding

Application for Program

Homeowner certifies that the property is theirs and it is not owned by a business or company. (This demonstrates that Davis-Bacon Wage Rates don't apply to this project)

Utility Inspection Form
